

## ANTI-CORRUPTION CLAUSE

### Anti-corruption clause

The Partner hereby declares that it is aware of Magyar Telekom Group's obligation to comply with its rules of ethical business conduct and anti-corruption as well as the anti-corruption laws applicable to this Agreement and undertakes not to use the consideration received by it under this Agreement for any unlawful purposes, in particular not to give or promise, directly or indirectly, any unlawful advantage to any public official or public organization for the purpose of assisting the Magyar Telekom Group or any person acting on its behalf to obtain any unlawful advantage.

The Partner declares that its member, officer, or employee is not a public official or public organization and shall immediately notify and make a new declaration if there is any change in this regard.

Under the entire term of this Agreement, the Partner warrants that

- in relation to this Agreement, it shall not engage any person, contributor, or representative who does not comply with the anti-corruption rules; and
- immediately informs the other party on any breach of the anti-corruption rules.

The Partner shall cooperate with Magyar Telekom Group in compliance procedures related to this Agreement, in particular in relation to anti-corruption rules.

Public officials include:

- a member or official of a government, ministry, other national or regional government body, public authority or body assisting its work (legislative, administrative or judicial body) or municipality, whether or not in fact employed or engaged by the former public organization;
- an individual acting on behalf of the above;
- a political party or an official thereof;
- a candidate for the public official legal status;
- an official or employee of international organizations, such as the United Nations or the World Bank;
- individuals who have functional authority as an official;
- consultant of public organizations or public officials;
- an officer and employee of public-owned enterprises and institutions, even those operating in a commercial capacity, including hospitals, healthcare, and educational institutions.

The term of "Public organization" includes: Central or regional, state, governmental (including the decentralized organizations operating under supervision of the government), local governmental or international, legislative, administrative or judicial organization.
